

East Hills Girls Technology High School e-Safety Resource

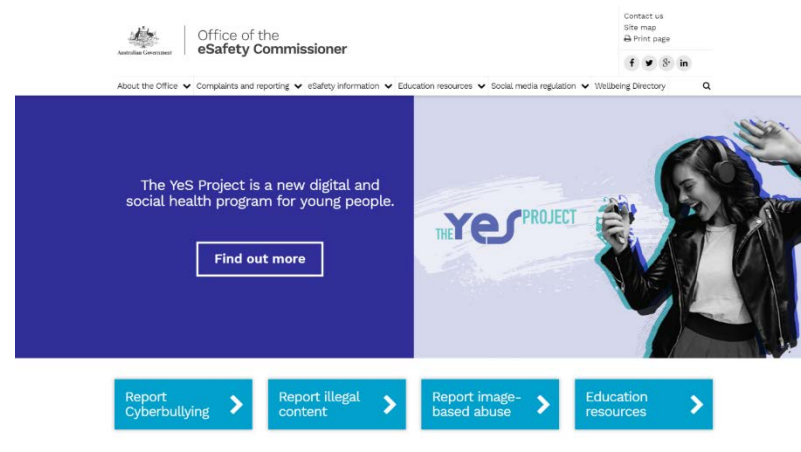
Students of Year 7 at East Hills Girls Technology High School will participate in a range of educational experiences to help them to develop their digital citizenship. Digital citizenship is refers to the safe practice and legal use of digital technologies. It encompasses topics such as safe use of social media, cyberbullying, sharing of personal information, netiquette, and the positive use of technology.

Some of the tools used by students at EHGTHS are:

1. e-Safety Commission

The [e-Safety commission](#) is responsible for promoting online safety in Australia. The office of the e-Safety Commissioner is responsible for dealing with complaints for young Australians who experience Cyberbullying. It will identify and remove illegal content, focusing on image-based abuse.

The site also contains a number of [educational resources](#) where you can access an Interactive game-based educational experience, called "[The Lost Summer](#)", which educates students about social media and acceptable online behaviour.
